

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2024/25

Doctoral studies

Field of Art Education

Basic conditions for admission

An officially certified copy of a master's degree, in the case of education obtained at a university other than a Czech or Slovak university, an officially certified copy of the master's degree nostrification.

Officially certified copy of the certificate – certified English exam proving B2 level English language proficiency. The certificate does not have to be presented by foreign applicants who provide a certificate of study (secondary or university) in English.

1st Round

Round 1 will take place without the presence of the candidates. The committee will study the required attachments to the application (i.e., CV, portfolio, dissertation concept and motivation letter). Evaluation criteria: quality of the project, quality of previous work, contribution to UMPRUM. Each item is evaluated on a scale of 0-5 points (maximum 15 points). Candidates scoring 7 points or more will advance to the second round. Round 1 is evaluated by an Admissions Committee appointed by the Rector and approved by the Doctoral Program Board of the Výtvarná umění/Visual Arts Program. Applicants who score 6 points or less in the admissions procedure will be judged unsuccessful and will receive a decision not to be admitted to study due to failure in the entrance examination.

2nd Round

The second round takes the form of an interview via distance communication tools. The admissions board assesses the qualifications of each applicant and expresses its assessment by scoring according to the following criteria:

- Quality of the submitted project: 0 - 5 points
- Quality of previous work: 0 - 5 points
- Ability to argument: 0 - 5 points

The interview is conducted in English.

Conditions for admission

- The total value of the admissions result is given by the sum of all the values for the individual items assessed in Round 2.
- A candidate may be considered for admission if he/she achieves a total of 9 points (maximum 15 points).

- Applicants who score 8 points or less in the admissions procedure will be judged unsuccessful in the admissions procedure and will receive a decision not to be admitted to the course due to failure in the admissions examination.
- Applicants are ranked in order of their overall entrance examination score from highest to lowest.
- The Rector of UMPRUM decides on the final admission of an applicant to study on the basis of the recommendation of the Admissions Committee.
- The Rector will admit such a number of successful applicants to study that the resulting number of enrolled students does not exceed the maximum possible capacity. The maximum number of admitted applicants in the Visual Arts doctoral program is 8. It is not necessary to fill the maximum number of applicants.
